DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The original house was apparently a small planter's house measuring 42' x 19', with a kitchen, which has been excavated. The residence, probably built around 1700, and the kitchen, built after 1740, were both frame structures. No structures remain above ground, and any other buildings which may have been there have not yet been found.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Frederick Jones, later Chief Justice of North Carolina, probably bought this property around 1701 and later sold it to Judith Bray. The house may have been built by Jones, or it could have been built shortly before he acquired it. Later the house was a tenant house, or quarter, and was destroyed by 1781. The archaeological test made by Noël Hume in 1960 and 1961 hints at the great amount of buried information which may yet be found in further excavations at the site. Only a small portion, in fact, was dug. The artifacts from Tutter's Neck were found in closely datable deposits and as such throw valuable light on the personal possessions of Virginians in the eighteenth century.
