Kiskiack, or the Lee house, is a structure typical of the small brick farm dwellings built in Virginia during the late-seventeenth century. The house is one-and-a-half stories covered by a gable roof with a fifty-five degree pitch, making it one of the steepest of the period in Virginia. All four walls are finely laid in Flemish bond with glazed headers above the beveled water table, with English bond below. Unfortunately the walls have been painted a number of times, and large areas of the brickwork have been clumsily repointed. Also various alterations and additions have resulted in badly scarred patches on the walls. Apparently because of the later additions (Now removed), the water table has been cut off on the end walls and much damaged on the west wall. The two first-story windows on the south gable have been bricked up, while the two windows on the north gable have been altered into a door and smaller window. The pair of very small windows on the second floor of both gable ends generally retain their original dimensions.

Probably the most impressive architectural features of Kiskiack are the T-shaped chimney stacks of the two interior end chimneys. The nearly identical stacks are classics of their type, featuring superb molded brick caps.

In keeping with the structure's central passage plan, the entrance (west) facade is symmetrical with a central doorway. The large dormer windows on this front are twentieth century replacements of nineteenth century additions. Unfortunately, all but the masonry portions of Kiskiack were destroyed when the house caught fire on February 24, 1915. The last private owner of the house, Francis Henry Lee, described the interior as he remembered it before the fire:

Wide floor boards; stairs on left, above turning to the right, ash banister, closet in the north room downstairs in the northwest corner. Door in the northeast side leading to kitchen when present, closet under steps. Open fireplaces downstairs only. Wooden pegs and handmade nail used.

Whether any of the original interior trim survived up to the 1915 fire is uncertain.

In 1927 the house was presumably renovated for occupancy with repairs being made to the roof, floor, and walls, and the construction of a back porch and protruding second-floor bathroom. In 1937 the present enclosed brick entrance porch was added, and in 1953 the rear porch and bathroom were removed.

At present Kiskiack is being preserved structurally although the interior fabric is badly decayed. The rural setting of the house has been preserved by the Naval Weapons Station. A Lee family burying ground is located nearby, but only one monument composed of fragments of other markers identifies its location.

The original tract of land on which Kiskiack is located was patented in several stages by an immigrant, Henry Lee, who obtained the first patent, for 247 acres, in 1641, and added to the property in 1650 and again in 1653. The name of the house, which is spelled about eight different ways, was taken from a local tribe of Indians known as the Kiskiacks. It has often been suggested that Henry Lee was related to the ancestors of General Robert E. Lee, but no genealogical evidence has been uncovered which would support this. Of Henry Lee's position in the colony, it is known that he served as a justice for the Court of York County in 1646 and was a member of the House of Burgesses in 1652. Unfortunately, it is not known whether it was Lee himself or one of his descendants who built the small brick house. Architectural historians generally agree that Kiskiack is in the style of the late-seventeenth century, thus creating the possibility that it was constructed either by Henry Lee's son, Henry, Jr., who inherited the land in 1657, or by his grandson William, who owned the property from 1696 to 1728. Kiskiack remained in the ownership of the Lee family until 1918 when it and adjoining lands were acquired by the Federal Government. The property is now the Naval Weapons Station, a high security military installation, off-limits to the general public.

Despite the obscurity of its origin, Kiskiack is a rare survival of a typical early Virginia country house. The quality of both its design and construction is a testament to the high standards of craftemanship attained by Virginians during the first century of settlement.
