DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL-APPEARANCE

Located on Charles Street in a residential district of Fredericksburg, the Mary Washington House is an exceptionally long composite frame structure of one-and-one-half and two stories set on a low brick and stone basement. The southern section is the earliest dating from the mid-eighteenth century. The other portions were incorporated later in that century and early in the next. The house faces east and is clad with beaded weatherboards except for the lean-to of the southern section, which is built of brick. Six-overnine and six-over-six sash are used throughout the house, and all of the windows have louvered blinds. The doorway into the central of the three main sections has a rectangular, leaded-glass transom. Gable roofs cover the southern and central sections, and a gambrel roof covers the northern portion. A pair of gabled dormers lights the southern wing, and shed roof dormers are used on the northernmost one. This latter section also has a central brick chimney, while all the other wings of the house have interior end brick chimneys. Single-story porches stretch across the rear of the central and part of the northern portions of the house.

The plan is a complex one. The southernmost (story-and-a-half) wing has a single cell with a full-width lean-to behind it. The central block is a two-story, single-pile structure with a through-passage containing the stair and principal entry to the south and a large drawing room to the north. This abuts the northern, story-and-a-half wing consisting of a dining room and chamber, with a chimney between, and connected to the main block by a small, secondary entrance vestibule. Behind this section, and slightly offset to the north, is a single-story ell with a dining room, kitchen, and pantry.

Federal-style trim is used throughout the house. The most noteworthy work is in the drawing room of the central block. A wainscot consisting of molded panels under a chair rail decorated with punch-and-dentil work encircles the room. The chimney piece is an elaborate affair consisting of applied-mold, flush-panel pilasters, entablature blocks having a fluted frieze, and an extremely heavily molded mantel shelf. Reeding, punchwork, and Vitruvian scroll moldings enrich the entablature of the spandrel. An overmantel above all of this consists of flush paneled pilasters framing a single, large flush panel, carrying a frieze with fluting in initation of triglyphs. The whole carries a molded cornice which is continued around the room. The chamber over this, "George Washington's Room," contains a mantel that resembles the drawing room overmantel, featuring paneled pilasters and a fluted "triglyph" frieze, all crowned by a heavily molded shelf with a dentil cornice.

The front room in the southern portion, known as "Mrs. Washington's Best Room," contains a mantel like that in the George Washington room but without the carved enrichment. Over it is an overmantel like that in the drawing room, but again without the enrichment, having a molded rather than a flush, overmantel panel. Molded panel wainscoting completes the decoration here.

In the main entrance hall, the triple-run stair is the only decoration of note. It has a molded handrail, three turned balusters to the tread, simple sawn brackets, and raised-panel side panels. As such, it is out of keeping (see continuation sheet # 2)

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Mary Washington House, the last home of George Washington's mother, was purchased for her by her eminent son. It was in this house that Washington last saw his mother, and it was here that she died in August, 1789.

Among the earliest recorded owners of the property were Washington's sister and brother-in-law, Betty and Fielding Lewis, who sold the property, apparently with some portion of the present house already standing on it, to Michael Robinson in 1761. In 1772, Washington bought it for his mother, who had lived at Ferry Farm near Fredericksburg since 1739. He did it, as he wrote to Benjamin Harrison, "at her request but at my own expense..., that she might be near by sister [Betty] Lewis, her only daughter," who lived close by at Kenmore.

The house has been recognized as a historic shrine ever since Mrs. Washington took up residence there. Visitors to the city throughout the past two centuries have commented upon it. Almost thirty years after her death, for instance, John Gadsby Chapman painted the "Residence of Washington's Mother in Fredericksburg, Va.," now hanging in the National Gallery. The house became the property of the Association for the Preservation of Virginia Antiquities in 1890. In 1929-30, a careful restoration was undertaken under the direction of architect Philip Stern.
