

historical physical appearance delineated the Multiple Property for Documentation Form the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia in Section F, Item II. Description.

3101 South Located behind Manchester Street, Arlington, Virginia (Woodlake Towers Condominiums), the Southwest No. 7 Mile Marker of Aquia sandstone lies along the fence line between the condominium grounds and Kenmore Intermediate School. Access to the marker is from the parking lot behind the condominium adjacent to the condominium tennis courts. This marker is askew, leaning toward the southwest, and

has been defaced by other markings and cuts into the stone. Some of the scars may be from Civil War bullets or grapeshot. Both Fort Ramsay and Fort Buffalo were nearby and the marker may have been used for target practice. The wrought iron fence is rusted and its paint is flaking. A chain link fence runs along the property line and connects with two sides of the iron fence surrounding the stone. There is no plaque. Ownership is jointly held by Woodlake Towers Condominium Association, which authorized entry onto the property, and Arlington County, Virginia. While stewardship of this stone belongs to Fairfax County Chapter, VADAR, it was surveyed on 1 November 1989, by Mrs. John Turbyfill of Anna Maria Fitzhugh Chapter, VADAR, Springfield, VA.

The Southwest # 7 marker is significant because it marked the seventh mile on the southwest side of the District of Columbia, seven miles from the South Cornerstone at Jones Point.

In the early survey of 1906, the stone showed scars from bullets or grapeshot. It was close to Fort Ramsay and Fort Buffalo, which may account for the scars. Apparently the markers were used for target practice during the Civil War.
