NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

The Walker's Creek Cemetery, the sole resource added in the Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church Boundary Increase, contains a range of memorial types and styles typical of the twentieth and early twenty-first centuries. Low rectangular monuments of gray Georgia granite predominate, most carved with sedate floral patterns and geometric borders. A few white marble monuments date to early in the cemetery's development. The most impressive of these is that of Civil War veteran Andrew Johnston Bane (1842-1911), carved with high-relief acanthus leaves at the corners. Next to it stands the black granite monument of Nannie E. Bane (1855-1917), distinguished by a pedimented cap and Art Nouveau floral carvings. Decorative motifs are conventional and include lambs (for the graves of infants and children), Masonic emblems, and a caduceus. Although the cemetery remains in use, the majority of monuments appear to be over fifty years old. The cemetery occupies a terrace above Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church at the foot of a wooded hillside, and has views of the Big Walker Creek Valley. A group of tall Norway spruce planted in 1947 clusters near the entrance at the northeast corner. The cemetery is enclosed by a modern chain link fence and has the manicured lawn appearance of most twentieth century cemeteries. The church and cemetery are separated by about seventy-five yards at their closest points.

NARRATIVE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Walker's Creek Cemetery, the sole resource added in the Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church Boundary Increase, is eligible for listing as a contributing resource associated with the 1898 Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church, which was listed under Criterion C in the area of architecture in the Virginia Landmarks Register and the National Register of Historic Places in 2003. The cemetery originated in 1911 with the burial of Andrew Johnston Bane on what was then a meadow on his farm. Bane was a member of Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church, and he and his wife Nannie Allen Bane had donated a tenth-acre of their farm for the construction of the church in 1897. In 1915 Nannie Bane donated one acre for the establishment of the cemetery to the Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church. Since then the cemetery has developed as the principal burial ground for the surrounding Big Walker Creek Valley. The Norway spruces near the entrance were planted in 1947 soon after the reorganization of the church's Woman's Auxiliary in 1945. The church deeded the cemetery to the Walker's Creek Cemetery, Inc., in 1994, placing the church and cemetery in separate ownership.

The cemetery stewards seek designation to encourage present and future appreciation of the historical and design characteristics of the cemetery and to encourage its preservation. The stewards would have included the cemetery with the nomination for the adjacent Walker's Creek Presbyterian Church had they been more aware of their options.


