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Since its completion in 1845, St. Paul's has served as a house of worship for many of Richmond's and the South's leading citizens. Both Jefferson Davis and Robert E. Lee, as well as many of Virginia's governors, attended services there. It was during service at St. Paul's, on the fateful morning of April 2, 1865, that President Davis received word that General Lee could no longer hold Petersburg, and that government should evacuate Richmond.

St. Paul's, unlike many downtown churches, has remained a most active parish. Its architectural distinction, as well as its rich historical associations, make the church one of the South's most significant landmarks.

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
